Grading

Grades will be updated one to two times a week. Assignments will be weighted according to the points in each category, so that assignments that require more work will be weighted more heavily. Each category grade will be determined by the total number of points earned divided by the total number of points possible. The overall grade will be based on the category grades averaged using the percentages listed above. Rubrics will be used to grade all writing assignments, all projects, and most other activities.

Urbana Middle encourages parents to regularly check their students grades on HAC. The following list of codes is provided to help parents better understand the HAC grading system.

- * An E is issued to excuse work, which neither hurts nor helps a grade
- \ast A Z is used to indicate that an assignment was never turned in and will change once the assignment is turned in and graded.
- *An O in the gradebook signifies that the student earned a zero on the assignment and cannot be changed

Classroom Consequences

Urbana Middle School follows the PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports) program, which is a school wide approach to discipline. Our goal is to change behaviors that are disruptive to the learning environment. In accordance with the PBIS program, students will be rewarded with WINGS for positive behavior and there will be consequences for failure to follow behavior quidelines and expectations.

Consequences are accumulated SCHOOL WIDE for each student, not in each individual classroom. PBIS steps reset at the start of semester 2.

- 3. Second classroom reflection with Parent Contact
- 4. Lunch detention with Parent Contact
- 5. After school detention with Parent Contact
- 6. Admin Conference with Parent Contact

LATE WORK POLICY

The UMS late work policy has changed this year. If an assignment is turned in on time, credit will be given for IOO% of the earned grade.

Credit will be deducted based on how many days late the assignment is:

I day late: Credit given is 90% of earned grade

2 days late: Credit given is 80% of earned grade

3 days late: Credit given is 70% of earned grade

A days late: Credit given is 60% of earned grade

5 or more days late: Credit given is 50% of earned grade

No more than 50% of the earned credit will be deducted for late work.
